## A MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parents and Friends

As the Easter holiday draws near, we can look back on another very successful term. Both staff and students have been working extremely hard.

Work is now under way in the construction of our new manufacturing centre. Contractors have been on site for two weeks and the foundations are now in place. This weekend, large beams will be craned into position to form the super structure for the building. All being well, the building should be complete by May half term which will allow the fitting out of the centre with the latest Computer Aided Design and Computer Aided Manufacturing equipment in readiness for courses commencing in the new academic year. Staff and students, I know, are excited about this development. I am also pleased to say that plans have now been submitted for the extension of our Learning Resource Centre. The extension will provide much needed accommodation for the Sixth Form private study, as well as a space for new IT facilities.

Talking of IT, one of the great changes that have taken place in the school over the past twelve months, is the increasing use of Information Technology. IT is in daily use around the school and is having a significant impact on students' learning. On a recent tour around school, students could be found making use of IT in their English, Science, Technology, Languages, Mathematics and Business Studies lessons. Students in learning support were also involved in the interactive Success Maker programme. Those visiting the school cannot fail to be impressed by the scale and quality of work involving IT.

At the time of writing, a party of our students are visiting our partner school in Felsberg, Germany.

They are spending a week staying with families seeing the school at work and visiting places of interest. As someone who has been on the exchange before, I was impressed with the hospitality of our partner school and the welcome received. Our students will, I know, benefit immensely from the experience.

For students preparing for examinations, it is important that full use is made of the Easter holiday for revision. Many students have been issued with revision guides and given advice on how they may best revise. It is vitally important that students are encouraged to undertake revision on a daily basis throughout the holidays and the build up to the public examinations. Here in school, we are also working hard to support young people with lunch time revision clinics, and Easter revision days. The LRC will also be open late for revision on two evenings a week (Tuesdays and Thursdays from the 9<sup>th</sup> April to the 16<sup>th</sup> May from 4-6pm) to help children with revision.

One final point. We have been experiencing problems lately with students who have failed to attend school wearing the correct uniform. Enclosed within this Kings Messenger is a list of the uniform requirements. I am asking all parents to support the school by ensuring that their child comes dressed correctly. I look forward to receiving full support from everyone.

Finally, on behalf of us all at The Kings of Wessex, I hope you and your family have an enjoyable Easter.

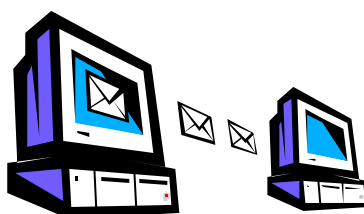
## ICT AND OTHER RESOURCES

We have also been able to develop ICT provision. In terms of hardware, there is now an ICT room dedicated to Maths and English. We have also needed to look at the software we use. We have tried out an ILS system and investigated various Internet resources this year, with a view to integrating them into our work next year. We are developing work related study in the same way. This term has been one of preparation for the future. Resources such as revision books for the main school will be available after Easter, and will help with exam revision.

# Uniform

Students must wear uniform at all times. This is a requirement of the school and we look to parents for your support in ensuring that students are correctly dressed.

**Students in Year 9, 10 and 11 are required to wear the following items of clothing:**

Jumper/Cardigan	- <u>Bottle green V-necked with school emblem</u>
Shirt/Blouse	- <u>Plain white with collar</u>
Trousers/Skirt/Culottes	- <u>Black [Skirts/Culottes should be on or a round the knee in length</u>
Socks/Tights*	- <u>Black</u>
Shoes	- <u>Plain black shoes</u>
Tie	- <u>School tie - black and green</u>

- It is a requirement that socks/tights are worn by all students from September to April

**Please note that we do NOT allow training shoes, open shoes, sweatshirts, jumpers/cardigans other than school type, fashion trousers or skirts, polo shirts, shorts, denims, suede or leather of any type. Students are not permitted to wear hats during the school day.**

School jumpers/cardigans and ties are available from our stockists: Deane & Sons, Bath Street, Cheddar.

Students attending school in incorrect uniform will be asked to ensure that they attend wearing the correct uniform on the following day and parents will be informed by letter. Items of clothing may be confiscated and/or students may be placed in detention. In certain cases as students may be withdrawn from lessons until the correct item of uniform is worn.
