Update from Mr Brown on Green Travel Plan	Focus on road safety – looking at safe routes to school etc. The School Council have gained a grant of £10,870 towards the replacement and extension of the protective rails on the bus loop and bicycle storage. We are going to resite the cycle shed beside the LRC at the Memorial entrance. This is a good site because of the CCTV coverage and also offers a separate entrance for cyclists. The School Governors have agreed to this and we have been given permission to go ahead for 40 bikes. In time this could be expanded to 60. Cost of 40 places would be approximately £4,000. The Governors are happy to fund the preparation and the surfacing. This would be a Summer 2008 project ready for September.
