

AN EXPLANATION OF GRADES USED IN THE YEAR 10 GRADE REVIEW

<u>Target Grade</u> is given as an indication of the minimum final grade a student should aspire to achieve in a subject and is based upon their results in the KS2 national tests.

<u>Predicted Grade</u> is the overall grade a student will achieve in their final exam if they continue to produce the same quality of work with the same level of effort as they are currently demonstrating.

<u>Science</u>

All Year 10 students are studying the content of the Combined Science specification so the "double grade" reflects their progress on this course. Decisions will be made as to the most appropriate route for individual students (Combined or Triple Science) after the Year 10 exams.

PPE Grade is the grade for the recent internal assessment undertaken. It is indicative of the grade achieved in the skills and content covered in that assessment only.
