

AN EXPLANATION OF GRADES USED IN THE YEAR 11 GRADE REVIEW

<u>Target Grade</u> is given as an indication of the minimum final grade a student should aspire to achieve in a subject and is based upon their results in the KS2 national tests.

<u>Predicted Grade</u> is the overall grade a student will achieve in their final exam if they continue to produce the same quality of work with the same level of effort as they are currently demonstrating.

Colour highlighting indicates where the Predicted Grade is in relation to the Target Grade.

Green - Above Target Yellow - On Target Red - Below Target
