SUBJECTS

Kings Sixth is a vibrant Sixth Form which offers a wide range of A Level and vocational courses leading to qualifications after two years. Advice on course choices, combinations or the number of subjects and entry requirements is available online as well as from staff at the Academy. Please note courses will only run if viable. Students of all abilities are well catered for, including those with learning needs.

TIMETABLE

Lessons

Eight lessons a fortnight per A Level or A Level equivalent.

Tutor Time

Every student is part of a tutor group and will register with them at the start of each day as well as attending extended tutor once a week, where a programme of activities takes place, including PSHE and careers information.

Study Periods and Period 9

During study periods you will be expected to undertake preparatory work for lessons. Period 9 is a study period for your chosen subjects. Homework is an essential part of all Sixth Form courses and you should aim to spend one hour on homework for every hour taught. Students who are members of Kings Leisure and Fitness and/or a part of the Sports Academy are permitted to use these facilities during study periods. This includes a fully equipped air-conditioned gym, swimming pool, fitness studios and café.

Enrichment

Enrichment opportunities are provided every Wednesday afternoon e.g. sports, EPQ, Rising Stars, volunteering and many more. In Year 12 these sessions are a compulsory part of your timetable.

Academic Mentoring

Your tutor will mentor you throughout the two years, discussing any issues you or your teachers may have and giving you the structure to set yourself individual targets. They will also write your UCAS references. Your progress will be measured against target grades based on your GCSE performance.

Year 12 students will be expected to undertake the opportunity to undertake a week of **work-related learning** for which they will be supported both in preparation and participation by our dedicated Employability Coordinator. This is an excellent extra-curricular activity to add to your CV or personal statement, and a placement offers you the opportunity to experience a vocational area of your choice.
