



Project Outcomes

Beyond Reality

Understand the scope of different creative, media and design industries, whilst developing knowledge of artists.

You will develop collage composition and artistic techniques, your ability to use the principles of design whilst working to a design brief. Communicating and expressing ideas in the form of design.

You will make a surreal collage head shot.

People and Places Part A

The Holocaust – consider the impact on people and places with real examples of people's experience. The focus is diversity.

You will develop your ability to work in a group, discuss and evaluate whilst using skills of chronology, reading and research.

You will produce a poster and presentation and deliver this to the group on one person's Holocaust experience.

Extending Horizons Part A

Investigating a range of pastry foods available, making sausage rolls and evaluating their nutritional content to create a food label with the legally required information.

You will develop your knowledge and understanding of food labelling and creative design working to a brief. You will further refine motor skills and the use of kitchen equipment.

Safe to eat sausage rolls will be made with a food label.

Music and Exploring Melodrama Part A

Learn how to use a digital audio workstation and to produce electronic music.

You will develop your IT skills, composing and the use of loops and sample. You will work in pairs and groups to listen effectively and devise creatively.

You will produce an electronic dance track and performance sketch.

Music and Exploring Melodrama Part B

Learn about the historical context of Victorian Melodrama, stock characters, developing your characterisation and stagecraft.

You will develop group work, creativity, decision-making, improvisation, performing, resilience and literacy.

You will participate in a short scripted performance .

Race Across Europe

Learn through 'visiting' six different European countries about the different aspects of culture, tradition, history and geography.

You will develop cultural awareness, linguistic understanding and geographical knowledge.

You will design, record and predict in your race booklet.

People and Places Part B

A study of the human and physical geographical aspects of the Middle East.

You will develop your map reading and interpretation skills, understand population density and distribution and consider the global importance of religion and impact.

Each group will have annotated maps demonstrating physical and human attributes with Q and A relating to the importance of oil and religion.

Extending Horizons Part B

Investigate the strength in structures and design, build, test and evaluate in spaghetti.

You will develop your knowledge of structural design and strength whilst being creative and analytical in a group.

A spaghetti bridge tested to destruction.

The Tuck Shop

Explore a range of packages to plan for a new school Tuck Shop.

You will further your knowledge of Word, PowerPoint, Excel and develop your ability to search the internet effectively.

Your group will produce a range of documents including a letter and spreadsheet to show how the Tuck Shop will work before evaluating them.
