RPE Bristol Visit - Wednesday 19 March 2025

The Religion, Philosophy, and Ethics Department is delighted to offer 45 Year 9 students the opportunity to visit Bristol Park Row Synagogue, Bristol Cathedral and watch Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat at the Bristol Hippodrome on Wednesday 19 March 2025. Although, this trip is not essential for the course it will support your son/daughter with their knowledge of Judaism and Christianity in preparation for the Year 10/11 GCSE course.

The trip will leave on **Wednesday 19 March 2025 at 9:00am and return on the same day at approximately 6:30pm**. As the trip returns after the end of the school day, it is the responsibility of parents/carers to arrange transport home from the school trip.

The total cost of this trip will be **£50** which includes:

- Return coach travel to Bristol
- Entrance to places of worship (Synagogue/Cathedral)
- Lunch at ZaZa Bazaar Bristol
- A ticket to Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat

Payment for this trip must be made using the online ParentPay system. The trip will be available on ParentPay from **Wednesday 8 January 2025 at 8.00am**. If you are unable to pay online you can pay by cash at a store showing the Paypoint logo. You will need a Paypoint letter which is available from the Academy office. The letter has a barcode which is unique to this trip. ParentPay and barcode letters are also used as acceptance of your parental consent and that you are satisfied with the arrangements outlined above. Reply slips for consent are no longer issued. Please ensure that we have your up-to-date emergency contact details and any relevant medical information for your child, as this information is taken from our Academy database. Payments are non-refundable. Should your child withdraw from the trip, we are only able to offer a refund if their place can be filled by another student.

The visit will be covered by the Academy Insurance Policy. Please be aware that:

- Except for visits abroad, insurance arrangements are the same as those for pupils in the Academy, i.e. only provides cover if negligence is proven or accepted by the Academy and/or its employees
- You should consider making your own insurance arrangements for personal accident cover for your son/daughter for Academy activities in the UK
- As parent/carers you have fully understood and are satisfied with the details supplied about the above-mentioned activities. You agree to your son/daughter taking part in it, and know of no medical reason why he/she should not participate
